


CRAFT NAME	Scented Shell Candles
EQUIPMENT & QUANTITY 	<u>Per Teenager:</u> Large shells (Atlantic Scallop Deep online?) Wicks Wax of your choice (or tea lights to melt) Bowl or cup for wax Larger bowl Spoon Fragrance Glitter or smaller shells
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ACTIVITY (see separate document)	Play Activity 3 – Go Fish Aim: To broaden students knowledge of general craft vocabulary – you may want to add in some cards with appropriate words on (eg- shell, wax, wicks, fragrance)
Other Information	This may work best in small groups.

CRAFT METHOD	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Clean shells and dry thoroughly ● If painting shells use acrylics and leave to dry. Once dry spray with clear aerosol to fix paint. Meanwhile.... ● Remove aluminium from tea lights and then melt on a low heat Put in a tin/glass bowl within a boiling saucepan. Called a bain-marie (not directly into pan). As you would do when melting chocolate. ● Once wax is melted, carefully remove wicks and add fragrance. ● Place your wick a deepest part of shell ● Pour wax into shell moulds ● Sprinkle glitter or smaller shells into candle before it setsThe balloon will deflate after several seconds. Once it is deflated, remove the balloon and repeat steps 2-4!
